

# Mythology and ritual, Decomposition and rebirth

Storm King Art Center hosts two new exhibits in the summer of '22

torm King Art Center welcomes new works for the 2022 season with a special exhibition of outdoor and indoor sculptures by Wangechi Mutu (b. Nairobi, Kenya, 1972) and a new sitespecific commission by Brandon Ndife (b. Hammond, Indiana, 1991).

Mutu's exhibition foregrounds the artist's current practice in earth and

bronze sculptures, which populate Storm King's expansive landscape. The artist molds her ideas and materials to assert the existence and cultural relevance of ancient original myths, fables, and histories.

To accompany this exhibition, Storm King is planning in-person public programing with Mutu in the fall, including an outdoor

screening of her film works September 3 and an artist talk scheduled for October 1. An exhibition catalogue—featuring a statement by the artist, an essay by the artist and writer Aisha Bell, and an essay by Lawrence—will also be produced.

Further south in Storm King's fields, New York-based Brandon Ndife concurrently presents his largest and first outdoor sculptural project. Working primarily with domestic items, including furniture the artist makes by hand, Ndife manipulates objects' appearance by casting them in polyurethane foam and resin, often embedding the household items into the surfaces of the cast sculptures. The effect is one that is organic and sinister, suggesting a process of rot that subsumes the quotidian objects

and embalms them in a perpetual state of decay.

The exhibition interrogates, according to Ndife, the legacy of redlining, or the systematically sanctioned segregation of real estate, which recent studies have shown often left poorer communities and communities of color in urban areas with fewer greenspaces and less

tree cover. Rising temperatures and worsening impacts of climate change in formerly redlined areas contribute to the increased susceptibility of these communities to deadly heat waves. By inviting us to view Shade Tree beneath the tree canopies. Ndife encourages consideration of shade as both a natural phenomenon and a

phenomenon and a scarce commodity, saying: "Shade Tree is grounded by the universal truth that no place is exempt from economic and residential difference."

To accompany Ndife's exhibition, Storm King is planning in-person public programing with the artist in collaboration with local community organizations and programs in the city of Newburgh.

Storm King Art Center is open for the season through December 11, 2022. Hours are 10 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. weekdays (closed Tuesday) with extended hours (10 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.) on Fridays and Saturdays through Labor Day. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, "In the United States more children ages 1 to 4 die from drowning than any other cause of death except birth defects. For children ages 1 to 14, drowning is the second leading


cause of unintentional injury death after motor vehicle crashes."

There are two types of drowning connected to water safety. Fatal drowning which results in a death and nonfatal drowning which can lead to a range of outcomes including brain damage and other serious outcomes, including longterm disability. The CDC estimates there are 3,960 fatal unintentional drownings, including boating-related drowning and 8,080 nonfatal drownings per day in the United States.

Trish Corkedale, founder and CEO of Anchored Lifestyle LLC. in New Windsor, has been helping families understand the importance of swim safety for nearly two decades. Corkedale, a certified Water Safety Instructor (WSI), Lifeguard, and Lifeguard Instructor, began by working at a facility as a lifeguard and swim instructor, then worked her way up to becoming the Aquatics Director of that organization for many years. She now offers private







and group lessons at her home in addition to lifeguard prep training.

"I got into water safety because I had a passion for teaching, and I absolutely loved the water. I actually had a few close calls as a child in and around the water, but I didn't know that until after I became a WSI," she explained. "Swim lessons can be the difference between life and death for both children and adults. I have seen far too many incidents over the years, all of which could have easily been prevented. I think families can understand how important it is for their child to swim, but

I don't think families are aware of how early they should start. The sooner the better- even infants who cannot crawl or walk yet need swimming lessons," Corkedale shared.

There are safety measures that can be taken to create a safer water environment. Drowning can often be prevented by wearing appropriate lifejackets when on boats or water recreation vehicles and having security measures in place near pools. "A safe water environment would include pool fences that have a locked gate, pool stairs that are kept in the upright position when not in use, pool alarms, and lifejackets or other US Coast Guard approved apparatuses," explained Corkedale.

She urges parents and guardians to be vigilant with supervision at all

times. "Parents need to stay on their toes and children need to be supervised 100% of the time - even if your child can swim. Implement pool rules with your child and always discuss them prior to being around any body of water. If you are having a party or a large crowd, I highly recommend hiring a lifeguard. It is so easy to get distracted talking with another person or just running inside momentarily, thinking someone else is watching the pool. It only takes a split second for fun to turn into danger. This isn't just for pools and beaches, but bathtubs, ponds, lakes, and even water tables as well," she shared.

In addition, the CDC noted that while children are at the highest risk for drowning, adults are also at risk especially when it comes to boating-related drowning and nonfatal drownings. With the Hudson River and local lakes and ponds in our backyards, safety is key to avoid tragic outcomes. Corkedale expressed that parents also need to know how to swim and know their limitations in the water. "It is a natural instinct as a parent to jump in the water after your child who might be drowning, however I have seen many adults who do this and cannot swim themselves. This leads to terrible scenarios and unfortunate outcomes," she explained.

With swim safety a priority, summer can be a fun and relaxing time for families to enjoy. "Water play is so much fun, but tragedies can happen anywhere, at any time, in any amount of water," Corkendale says. "Be prepared, get involved, stay informed, stay safe, and have fun."
